Today's fears about artificial general intelligence (AGI), which is not only all-knowing, but also "sentient" (i.e. able to perceive *and feel* things) were already evoked by the sinister supercomputer <u>HAL 9000</u> in Stanley Kubrick's film "2001: A Space Odyssey". The film was released in 1968, and was based on a short story by Arthur C. Clarke, entitled *The Sentinel*, written in 1948 and published in 1951. (In the French version of the Kubrick movie, the computer was called <u>CARL 500</u>.)

This scene shows HAL refusing to let Dave return to the mother ship (the main spaceship) with his pod (*shuttle* here):

Dave: HAL, I won't argue with you anymore. OPEN THE DOORS.	
HAL: Dave, this conversation can serve no purpose any more. Goodbye.
