I. An anthropological approach to manifest destiny

A. The creation of a real identity for the US population

- Identity created to gather around a same Nation and religion
- Unification after an expansion towards North and West -> eased by the creation of a railroad
- B. The blind side of the indigenous massacre
- Ethnocide made through simple acts of conversion, acts of war and of ethnic purification (deportation, land spoliation, boarding schools ...)
- Ancient doctrine of tolerance was abandonned in favor of ethnocide

II. A political approach to manifest destiny


A. The rising of American imperialism
