I. THE ORIGINS OF THE SELF-MADE MAN



A) THE ORIGINS OF THE SELF-MADE MAN:

- COLONIZATION AND WESTWARD EXPANSION
 A moment that gave rise to American values and the importance of individualism
- America was a new word, a place of opportunity and new beginnings where the social distinctions and excesses of the "old world" did not exist.
- Also a religious origin : "God helps those who help themselves" and <u>The Protestant Ethic and the Spirit of</u> Capitalism
- this concept : "The Significance of the Frontier in American History" by Frederick Jackson Turner



B) THE POPULARIZATION OF THE "SELF-MADE

- MAN": INDUSTRIALIZATION AND 19TH CENTURY
 With the American Civil War (1861–1865) and the Industrial Revolution came the first great examples of self-made men
 - A concept that has been popularized by a wide variety of people and fields: politics with Benjamin Franklin, philosophy with Ralph Waldo Emerson and literature with Horacio Alger.
 Self-made men vary according to historical and economic circumstances
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 - darwinism.


