

Immigration in USA

I. History of American immigration:

- Immigration was the foundation of the United States (English settlers)
- **German immigration:** 1/3 of immigration in the 19th century, impacted the US a lot
- **Irish immigration:** the poorest immigration, due to **the Great Famine in Ireland** (moldew, a fungus which infected potatoes)
- Immigration was encouraged by **the American dream, the Golden Rush and Homestead Act of 1862**
- **From 1882 and Immigration Act**, the US wanted to control immigration.
- To control immigration, the US opened **Ellis Island in 1892.**



II. Immigration from 1930 to the 2000s:

- **Immigration act of 1924:** Establishment of the **National Origins Quota System** : allocated visas to each nationality based on their proportion of the U.S. population in 1890 **Limit** : 165.000 of immigrants.
- **Lowest level of immigration since the 1890s.**
- **Mexican Repatriation** : government deported thousands of Mexican Americans (many of whom were U.S. citizens).
- **After WWII : Humanitarian crisis in Europe** ⇒ Displaced Persons (DPs) **Act of 1948** : allowed over 400,000 European DPs to immigrate to the U.S
- **The Cold War** led the U.S. to accept **refugees fleeing communist regimes.**
- **Immigration and Nationality Act of 1965** : created a new system based on **family reunification and skilled immigrants.**



III. Immigration from the 2000s until now

- **From 2000 to 2010** = nearly 14 million new immigrants settled in the country: **the highest decade of immigration in American history.**
- **The September 11 of 2001 attacks** = more repression, more control over immigrants, more violence on the border with Mexico.
- **President Obama DACA program** (Deferred Action for Childhood arrivals)
- **450 miles of border wall along the US- Mexico border** was built under president Trump
- Immigrants and their U.S.-born children are representing about **27 percent of U.S. inhabitants in 2022**
- A recent **increase of immigration threatens Biden's immigration reform plans.**
