Aretha Louise Franklin (March 25, 1942 – August 16, 2018) was an American singer, songwriter [compositrice], pianist, and civil rights activist [militante des droits civique]. Franklin began her career as a child singing gospel at New Bethel Baptist Church in Detroit, Michigan, where her father C. L. Franklin was minister. At the age of 18, she embarked [se lance] on a secular-music career as a recording artist for Columbia Records. While Franklin's career did not immediately flourish [sa carrière n'a pas décollé tout de suite], she found acclaim [trouvé un success/être acclamée] and commercial success after signing with Atlantic Records in 1966. Hit songs such as "Respect", "Chain of Fools", "Think", "(You Make Me Feel Like) A Natural Woman", "I Never Loved a Man (The Way I Love You)", and "I Say a Little Prayer", propelled [l'ont propulsée] her past her musical peers [au delà de ses pairs de la musique]. By the end of the 1960s, Aretha Franklin had come to be known as "The Queen of Soul".
