"Here Comes the Sun" is a song by the English rock band the Beatles from their 1969 album Abbey Road. It was written and sung by George Harrison, and is one of his best-known compositions. Harrison wrote the song in early 1969 at the country house of his friend Eric Clapton, where Harrison had chosen to play truant [not to go to school] for the day to avoid attending a meeting at the Beatles' Apple Corps organisation. The lyrics reflect his relief at the arrival of spring and the temporary respite [a short rest] he was experiencing from the band's business affairs" [Wikipedia].

The song was written at the start of spring, after "a long, cold, lonely winter". But it captures the joy we can all feel, waking up on a clear sunny day, at any time of the year. It is surely not the most important or iconic song of the group (compared to say "Help", "Yellow Submarine", "Hey Jude" or "Let It Be"). But it is the most streamed song on Spotify, and in "May 2023, it became the Beatles' first song to surpass one billion plays on the platform, and the first song from the 1960s to achieve the **milestone** [a stone on the side of a road indicating a distance; an important event]".
