Tom Lehrer: "Who's Next?" (to get the "Bomb")

<u>Thomas Andrew Lehrer</u> was born April 9, 1928, in Manhattan's Upper East Side [one of the most expensive parts of New York]. He is an American musician, <u>singer-songwriter</u>, <u>satirist</u>, and mathematician, who later taught mathematics at university and musical theater. He recorded **pithy** [precise, forcefully, brief] and humorous, often <u>political songs</u> that became popular in the 1950s and 1960s. His songs often **parodied** [comic imitation] popular musical forms, though they usually had original melodies.

Lehrer was mainly influenced by <u>musical theater</u>. Many of his best-known songs were written for the satirical television show <u>That Was The Week That Was</u> (TW3). These were later released as a record with the same name. In the 1970s, we gave up writing songs and performing, preferring to teach instead.

"Who's Next?"
