In Memory of Brain Wilson, the Beach Boys and Surfin U.S.A.

Brian Douglas Wilson (June 20, 1942 – c. June 11, 2025) was an American musician, singer, songwriter, and record producer who co-founded the Beach Boys. Often called a genius for his **novel** (new, unusual) approaches to pop composition and **mastery** (control, knowledge) of recording techniques, he is widely **acknowledged** (recognised) as one of the most innovative and significant songwriters of the 20th century. His best-known work is distinguished for its high production values, complex <u>harmonies</u> and orchestrations, <u>vocal layering</u>, and introspective or **ingenuous** (very imaginative, clever) themes. Wilson is also known for his once-high vocal **range** (array, variety of tone) and lifelong struggles with <u>mental illness</u>. He is considered one of the greatest [pop] musicians of all time. Formed in 1961, the *Beach Boys* were originally three brothers, a cousin and a friend. <u>Surfin U.S.A.</u> was their first hit in 1963, and reflected the southern California youth culture of surfing, cars and romance – called the "<u>California sound</u>". The band was critically **acclaimed** (applauded, hailed) and commercially successful. When the Beatles arrived in the United States in 1964, beginning the "<u>British Invasion</u>", the Beach Boys came under strong competition, but managed to continue being successful. <u>Surfin U.S.A.</u> is emblematic of their style – happy, very white and privileged, but also much more complex musically than it seems.


