
Bob Dylan and Mr Tambourine Man (Beginners' level, A2)

Poetry – Beautiful writing with rhythm and emotion. Prize – Something given to a person for doing something great. Released – When a song or album is made available to the public. Imagination – The power to create pictures or ideas in your mind. Listener – A person who hears music or words. Journey – A long trip from one place to another.
