

What is economics?


- Economics can be defined in a few different ways
- Content vs methodology:
 - Economics is a behavioral science that studies the production, distribution, and consumption of goods and services
 - "Economics is... what economists do"

How can we mitigate the climate change?






How can data help us understand the world?

What do economists do?

- Economists have all kinds of jobs, such as professors, government advisors, consultants, and private sector employees.
- Using theoretical models or empirical data, they evaluate programs, study human behavior, and explain social phenomena.
- Their contributions inform everything from public policy to household decisions.

Undergraduate degree in Economics learning objectives

- How to answer economics questions (not necessarily to find the answer to the above questions!):
 - Use theoretical tools (i.e. explanation)
 - Use technical tools (e.g. statistics) employed by economists
 - Apply a multidisciplinary approach drawing on other disciplines (e.g. geography or philosophy)
- How to formulate new questions!

Who are you?

- 260 students enrolled in the International track:
 - 40% come from countries other than France,
 - Representing 40 different nationalities.
 - Around 30 students are enrolled as "Oui Si" (conditional admission) and must attend additional courses.
- Plus 100 preparatory classes students attending the International Track.
- In total, approximately 360 students are enrolled in the first year (L1) of the International Track.

Academic Program Structure

- The academic year is divided into two semesters of 13 and 12 weeks each—courses and schedules change every semester.
- First semester: September 15 to December 20, 2025.
 - Lectures (CM) begin the week of **September 15**.
 - Tutorials (TD and DE) begin the week of **September 22**.
- Second semester: January 26 to May 9, 2026.
- Holidays:
 - 1 week of Autumn Break (October 25 to November 2)
 - 2 weeks for the end of the year (December 20 to January 5)
 - 1 week of Winter Break (February 28 to March 8)
 - 1 week of Spring Break (April 25 to May 3)

Academic Program Structure

- At the end of each semester: final exams (examen partiel)
- January (courses of the 1st semester):
 - Tuesday, January 6, 2026, to Thursday, January 22, 2026
- May (courses of the 2nd semester):
 - Monday, May 11, 2026, to Tuesday, May 26, 2026
- Second exam session (retake) in June (for those who failed the first session in January and May):
 - June: Monday, June 15, 2026, to Saturday, July 4, 2026

Academic Program Structure

The timetable (22 hours per week) includes:

- Lectures (CM Cours Magistraux 15 hours) in lecture halls (same schedule for all students).
- Tutorials (TD Travaux Dirigés) in classrooms (small groups):
 - Students must choose their tutorial schedule from the available options during online course registration.
- "Direction d'Etude" (DE) sessions in lecture halls
 - Multiple tutorial groups for statistics and mathematics.

 - Introduction to Economics (Lecture + tutorials)
 - Economics History (Lecture)

 - Topics in Economics
- Quantitative tools unit (UE3, 12 ECTS)
 - Mathematics: Initiation to Economics Modelling (Lecture + tutorials)
 - Descriptive Statistics (Lecture)
 - Stats (DE)

Courses and Curriculum | 1st Semester

- UE 4 (3 ECTS): Minors (Secondary Subject) and Foreign language:
 - One out of the following courses (in French)
 - Gestion : introduction à l'économie d'entreprise 18h
 - Informatique : initiation à la programmation web 1,5h + 15h

 - Sociologie : sciences sociales découvertes 18h
 - Histoire : histoire économique: première révolution industrielle 18h
 - UNA Europa Microcredentials in Sustainability: Introduction to Sustainability (in English but on-line)
 - Foreign Language (compulsory)
 - Bonus: Theatre, sport, COGITECO, "métiers de l'économie", second course of language, second minors

Degree in Economics with Minor in...

- If you validate (with a final grade of at least 10 out of 20) four consecutive semesters of the same minor.
- Please note that the first semester (S1) is the semester of choice.
- The deadline for selecting the minor in S1 is October 4, 2025.

Courses and Curriculum | 2nd Semester

Assessment

- Assessment methods, three options:
 - Continuous assessment (CC) + final exam,
 - Continuous assessment only,
 - Final exam only.

The specific assessment method is determined by each course and will be clarified during the first class.



French Grading: a Comparison



Grading

- To validate a subject, you must get a final grade of 10 or higher in the relevant subject.
- Grades compensate each other:
 - Within a semester, compensation occurs between the teaching units (UE).
 - Compensation also occurs between semesters.
- Any subject with a grade of 10 or higher is permanently validated.
- Time Limit:
 - You have a maximum of 3 years to validate the L1 and L2 levels, unless an exemption is granted.

Regulations on Assessment and Grading

- Students who have successfully completed at least one semester may progress to the second year (L2) but must retake any failed subjects the following year.
- Students with professional activities may request to take the "final exam only" regime (where only exam grades count, and no continuous assessment are included).
 - Requests should be submitted as soon as possible (soon!) via email to the secretariat and must include proof of employment (e.g., work contract).
 - No requests for the final exam regime will be accepted after the first 5 weeks of classes.
- **Special cases** (e.g., accidents, long-term illness, etc.) require a specific request with supporting documentation. These cases are reviewed individually by the license program director.
 - Such situations must be addressed through the university medical service.

Retake Examinations

- Retake Exam Session (Second Session)
 - A resit exam session (for subjects from the 1st and 2nd semesters) is scheduled at the end of the academic year: **from June 15, 2026, to July 4, 2026**.
- You only retake the subjects you have not yet passed, unless the entire Teaching Unit (UE) has already been validated.
- The highest grade between the first session and the resit session will be retained.

Attendance Policy

- Attending tutorials is compulsory.
- A maximum of three justified absences are allowed for tutorial sessions (e.g., illness, accident, job interview, appointment for residence permit renewal, exam scheduled at the same time as the tutorial session, etc.).
- You must provide justification to the tutorial instructor (chargé de TD).
- Unjustified absences in tutorials may result in losing continuous assessment credit (considered as a failure), which could block your results.

Special Provisions Disability and Chronic Illness

- The **PMF Center** is equipped to accommodate students with **physical disabilities** (elevators, ramps, facilities for visually impaired students).
- Students with psychological disabilities, physical disabilities, chronic illnesses, or injuries can benefit from special arrangements for assessments (requests must be made before the end of November).
- Midterm exams: Additional time (one-third extra time).
- Final exams: Special assessment arrangements.
- Condition: A medical certificate must be provided to the university medical service.
- Note-taking assistance by fellow students in the same group is also available (handicap support program).

Opportunities for Studying Abroad

- Student mobility is possible in the second year (L2) and third year (L3).
- For one semester or a full academic year.
- You remain registered at Paris 1 and validate your semester or year through equivalency.
- Over 125 destinations are available through:
 - **ERASMUS Program** (Europe)
 - Mobility programs outside Europe (America, Asia and Pacific, Africa)
 - To see all destinations: https://paris1.adv-pub.moveonfr.com/carte-mobilites/ (Select Ecole d'Economie de la Sorbonne and Undergraduate/Licence)
- If you wish to go abroad in L2, you must prepare your application this year:
 - **December 1:** Application deadline for destinations outside Europe.
 - March 1: Application deadline for ERASMUS.

Time Table!

- Unlike high school, you partially decide your own timetable.
- Lecture timetables are the same for everyone, but you can choose among different tutorial groups, and thus different time slots.
- Be careful:
 - · First come, first served policy applies.
 - Choose tutorials that fit your schedule, as changes can be difficult.
 - Also, check the language course timetable.

When and how to choose your group of TD

Academic Registration:

- Online!
- Registration for tutorial groups (TD) takes place on September 10th.
 - Exception: Math has a different procedure (see the next slide).
- Register for your tutorial groups (TD) at: http://ipweb.univ-paris1.fr
- A specific procedure for language groups will be explained in a later slide.
- Note: Preparatory classes students have 4 dedicated tutorials groups
- Reminder: The deadline for selecting the minor in S1 is October 4, 2025.

Math Course Registration Procedure

- The math proficiency levels of students are heterogeneous. As a result:
 - There are students groups (TD) without math tutorials and groups with math tutorials.
 - The list of students with or without math tutorials will be available on the EPI platform under "Licence 1 International Track".
- Students from preparatory classes have a specific math course in their own institution.

- Registration for Language 1 (LV1) and Language 2 (LV2) (bonus)
- For S1 tutorial groups (TDs): From Friday, September 12, 7:30 AM to Sunday, September 21, 2025, at midnight.
- Important: Attendance at the first class is mandatory. If the instructor reports your absence, your reservation will be canceled.
- You can change or cancel your tutorial group (TD) on RéservaLang until the day it closes.




