THE USE OF PERSONAL PRONOUNS (I, you, she, he, it, we, they, etc.).

Personal pronouns can be used in different ways. Here are the four standard ones. (This information has been adapted from a Le Chat (Mistral) query (10 October 2025).

1/ Subject Pronouns: where the personal pronoun is the subject of the sentence:

Pronoun Example Sentence

I I love reading.
You You are my friend.

He He runs fast.
She She is a doctor.
It It is raining.

We We are going home. They play soccer.

2/ Object Pronouns: here the pronoun is the object of a verb (experiencing the action).

Pronoun Example Sentence

I like you.

Me She called **me**.

You

Him We saw **him** at the park.

Her I gave **her** a gift.

It He fixed it.
Us They invited us.
Them I helped them.

3/ Possessive Pronouns to indicate the ownership of something (who/what it belongs to).

Pronoun Example Sentence

Mine The book is mine.
Yours Is this pen yours?
His The bag is his.
Hers The idea was hers.
Its The cat licked its paw.
Ours The house is ours

Ours The house is **ours**.

Theirs The decision is **theirs**.

The decision is thens.

4/ **Possessive adjectives**: they come before the noun, and the take the gender of the owner/the possessor!

Adjective Example Sentence

My car is blue.

Your Your keys are on the table.

His His dog is friendly.
Her Her phone is new.
Its Its tail is fluffy.
Our Our team won!
Their Their house is big.

5/ Reflexive pronouns: they refer back to the subject of the sentence (used for emphasis).

Pronoun	Example Sentence
Myself	I hurt myself.
Yourself	You should believe in
	yourself.
Himself	He talked to himself .
Herself	She introduced herself .
Itself	The cat cleaned itself.
Ourselves	We enjoyed ourselves.
Themselves	They helped themselves .

Key Notes:

- "You" can be singular or plural.
- "It" is used for objects, animals, or sometimes babies when the gender is unknown.
- "They" is often used as a genderneutral singular pronoun (e.g., "Someone left their bag.").
