From “Breaking News” slides:

17 September: trade war, trade policy, tariffs, to upend (something), stocks, bond (type of security)

24 September: evangelist, revival, faith, spiritual reawakening (cf. The Great Awakening in colonial America), to quit, dispute, parent company (/subsidiary), to take a public stance, a brand’s social mission, to rein in.

1 October: a hike (fee or rate hike), to implement, to send ripples, to be furloughed, nonevent, inured (adj.), market reaction, bull market, a caveat, beleaguered (adj.).

8 October: Dame/Sir (in the UK), Archbishop of Canterbury, to be ordained, the NHS, resignation, to step down, to crave (something), Anglicanism, Anglican Communion, to trigger (an event), Hindutva.

15 October: creative destruction, an entrepreneur, established companies, to consist in/to consist of, a recipient (of an award), own-goal, tariff barriers, deglobalization, irrelevant.

22 October: (a) brazen heist, staffing/to staff, (trade) union, to endorse (something), (a) venture capitalist, an outlier, contrarian, a power broker, moral crusade, copycat (adj.), pitch-deck, Christian nationalism, Judeo-Christian (adj.), liberal (noun and adj., NB: political meaning in the US),

5 November: worship, a quip, espionage, off-the-cuff, back door (IT meaning), to ban/ a ban, to blacklist.

12 November: Remembrance Day, “Lest we forget”

26 November: The Pope, inhuman vs. inhumane, abortion, to be pro-choice/ to be pro-life.

10 December: to pander to someone, a turnaround, to promote, unapologetic, genuine (adj.), to find oneself at odds with someone or something, backlash, eugenics, to be a nod to (something), white supremacy, culture war, political spectrum.
