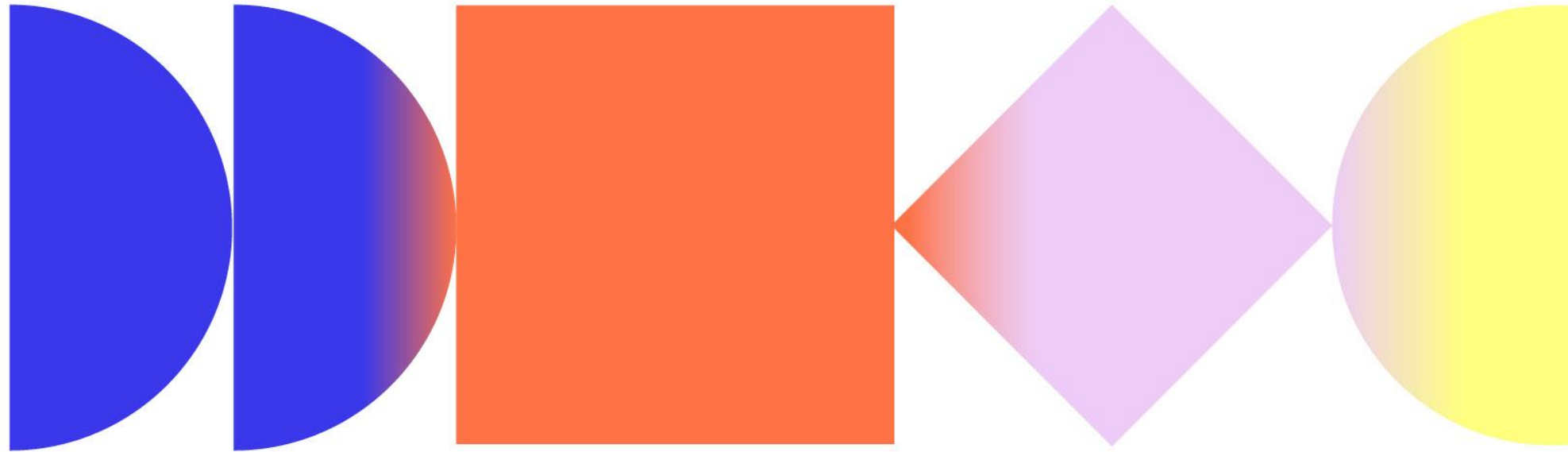


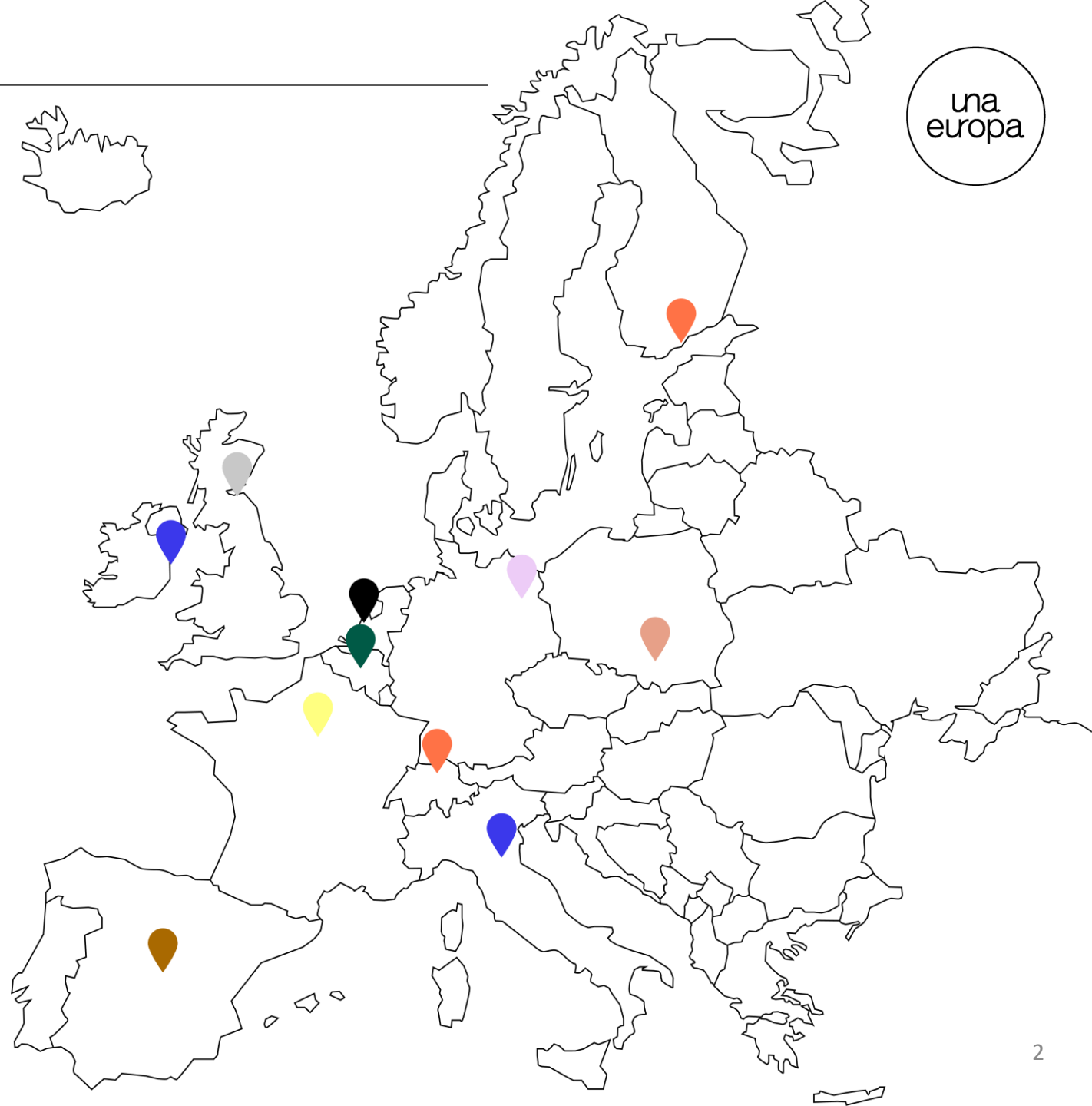

What is the Certificate in European Studies

- A short interdisciplinary training, open to Europe
- All in English
- 20 ECTS, on the top of your Bachelor degree, in 2 courses
- With some credits (first course) **transferable** to your degree in the Minor « UNA Europa European Studies » (2+2 in the second year of bachelor, 2 in the third year)
- Credit recognition through a « virtual mobility »
- The second course does not provide you with transferable credits, however it allows you to get the **Certificate**.



Content of the Certificate in European Studies



Two lectures (*European Integration* et *European Cultures and Societies*) proposed respectively in the Winter semester of the second and third year of Bachelor, followed jointly and remotely by the Certificate students, with other European studentes of the Alliance.

- *European Cultures and Societies* is composed of a lecture (3h/week), a **seminar** (5-6 sessions a year), a **group work**, and an **e-learning module**.
- *European Integration* is composed of a **lecture** in block teaching, a **seminar**, and a **group work**



We strongly encourage (but not mandatory) that you undertake a **physical mobility** (exchange semester) within the Alliance during your 3d year. You will be prioritized over these particular destinations.

European Integration, content and hours



Learning objective: analyse, through an interdisciplinary perspective, the stakes and challenges posed by the European integration, from its first developments to nowadays.



Second year of Bachelor, Winter semester

- +/- 30h of lectures
- +/- 20h of seminars



Exam :

- Final exam : mini-essay + multiple choice
- Continuous control : poster

European Cultures and Societies, content and hours :



A Understand the concept and idea of Europe as a cultural and historical reality within which different processes and dynamics (social classes, genders, ethnic groups, nationalisms) contribute to the construction of European identities. Analyze how cultural identities play an integrating or disintegrating role through organizations such as the European Union.



Third bachelor year, Winter semester

- +/- 36h of lectures
- +/- 10h of seminars
- e-learning module

Exam :



- Final exam : multiple choice questions
- Continuous control :
 - Multiple choice (e-learning module)
 - Group project (seminar)

Physical mobility (optional)

Mobility in the Third year (Winter semester, Spring semester or both)



Applications as usual, following strictly the International Relation's Erasmus or World mobility procedures.

Applications are composed of: a motivation paragraph (1500 characters max) in English ; a CV in English or French ; the transcript of records of your first semester in the International Track (not mandatory but recommended) ; a certificate of proficiency B2 in English (not mandatory).



The Certificate is **free of charge** for our students.
